A Local Law of the Town of Sanford Prohibiting the Use of Personal Watercraft and Specialty Prop-Craft on Oquaga Lake

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Sanford as follows:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. As used herein, the term "personal watercraft" shall mean a vessel which uses an inboard motor powering a water jet pump as its primary source of motive power and which is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing, or kneeling on, or being towed behind the vessel rather than in the conventional manner of sitting or standing inside the vessel.

As used herein, the term "specialty prop-craft" shall mean a vessel which is powered by an outboard motor or a propeller driven motor and which is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing or kneeling on or being towed behind the vessel rather than in the conventional manner of sitting or standing inside the vessel.

Section 2. FINDINGS. The Town Board of the Town of Sanford hereby finds and determines that adoption of this local law will promote the safety of the people and be in the best interests of the Town of Sanford.

Section 3. PROHIBITION. Pursuant to, and in accordance with, the provisions of subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subdivision 17 of Section 130 of the Town Law, the use, operation or driving of personal watercraft and the use, operation or driving of specialty prop-craft on Oquaga Lake in the Town of Sanford, County of Broome, State of New York are hereby prohibited within a distance of fifteen hundred(1500) feet from the shore of Oquaga Lake. No person shall use, operate or drive a personal watercraft or use, operate or drive a specialty prop-craft on Oquaga Lake in the Town of Sanford, County of Broome, State of New York within a distance of fifteen hundred(1500) feet from the shore of Oquaga Lake. Nothing herein shall be deemed to prevent access to federally maintained and designated channels.

Section 4. SIGNBOARD. A number of signboards complying with the requirements of Section 46 of the Navigation Law and facing the water of Oquaga Lake shall be constructed and conspicuously placed on the shore of Oquaga Lake, in accordance with Section 46 of the Navigation Law.

Section 5. VIOLATION. A violation of this local law shall be deemed an offense against this local law and shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding three hundred fifty dollars or imprisonment for a period not to exceed six months, or both. For the purpose of conferring jurisdiction upon courts and judicial officers generally, such a violation shall be deemed a misdemeanor and for such purposes only all provisions of law relating to misdemeanors shall apply to such a violation.

Section 6. SEPARABILITY. If any part or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered, and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law or the application thereof to any other persons or circumstances. The Town Board of the Town of Sanford hereby declares that it would have passed this local law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York as provided in Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
